- 1. Call Meeting to Order. *President Ken Kram called the meeting to order at 6pm. All Board members were present.*
- 2. Welcome Members of the Public. Visitors present were: Julie Christian (Weimar Mercury), Jim Singleton (SZH Architects), Mike Collier and Clayton Collier (Collier Construction), Cobby Caputo (Bickerstaff Heath Delgado Acosta LLP).
- 3. Pledge and Prayer *The U. S. Pledge of Allegiance, the Texas Pledge, and a prayer were recited.*
- 4. Public comments/audience participation. *None*.

The Board unanimously agreed to consider Item #6 - Closed session, next.
