- 1. Call meeting to order. *Vice-President Brian Christen called the meeting to order at 6pm. All Board members were present except Steve Williams and Tom Strickland.*
- 2. Welcome Members of Public; Pledge and Prayer *The U. S. Pledge of Allegiance, the Texas Pledge, and a prayer were recited. Visitors present were: Joe Marshall from the Weimar Mercury.*
- 3. End-of-year Budget Amendments for 2022-2023. *With a motion by Jeremy Maupin and second by Jim Sanders, amendments to the 2022-2023 budget were unanimously approved as presented.*
- 4. Public Hearing on Adoption of Budget, M&O Tax Rate and I&S Tax Rate for 2023. *No members of the public were present.*
- 5. Adoption of Budget for 2023-2024. With a motion by Jim Sanders and second by April Mikulenka, the 2023-2024 Budget, in the amount of \$10,550,624, was unanimously approved, as follows:

 - \$500 per employee (totaling about \$66,000) distributed throughout the year to all employees Funded by Esser Funds
 - The teacher salaries approved in this budget do not reflect any statutorily required salary allotments enacted by the Texas Legislature in the 88th Session. The district reserves the right to adjust salary amounts for the 2023-2024 school year in response to legislative changes.
- 6. Adoption of M&O Tax Rate for 2023. *With a motion by Jeremy Maupin and second by Joni Van Houten, the Board unanimously approved the 2023 M&O tax rate of \$0.6629. An amended motion*

made by Jeremy Maupin and seconded by Joni VanHouten was unanimously approved, correcting the rate to \$0.6692.

7. Adoption of I&S Tax Rate for 2023. With a motion by Joni VanHouten and second by Jim Sanders, the Board unanimously approved the 2023 I&S tax rate of \$0.21.
