

2026-2027 Weimar ISD Dress and Grooming Code

The WISD dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, instill discipline, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Each campus within the district has modified its dress code based on age, maturity level, and educational needs of the student involved. Variation in dress code standards from campus to campus should be expected.

All Weimar ISD Students:

- ❖ All clothing should be appropriately sized; should not be excessively loose or tight fitting
- ❖ Designs on clothing are not allowed with the exception of brand logos which should be no larger than 2 square inches (small post-it), Weimar Wildcat spirit designs, and College and United States Military Branch designs

Jewelry

- ❖ Any type of jewelry that may be deemed a hazard for the wearer or others is not allowed. (includes, but is not limited to the following: wallet chain, heavy chains or necklaces, rings with jagged or sharp ornamentation, grills, loose bracelets, rosaries, etc.)
- ❖ Visible body piercings will be limited to ears only, girls only (No facial or body piercings, No gauging of the ear lobes)
- ❖ Large Hoop or long dangling earrings may not be worn

Makeup

- ❖ Excessive or distinctive facial make-up, etc. deemed to be distracting is prohibited; (Principal's Discretion)

Hair Styles

- ❖ Must be clean, well-groomed, above the eyebrows (boys), and ears must be completely visible (boys)
- ❖ Hair color (i.e. yellow, blue, pink, purple, bright red, etc.) that is not a natural human hair color is prohibited
- ❖ Highlights must be throughout the hair, not just in one spot and must be one color
- ❖ No designs/razor lines in hair or eyebrows
- ❖ Hair must not touch the collar of a collared shirt (boys)/No ponytails, buns, or braids (boys)
- ❖ No facial hair
- ❖ No sideburns past the ears
- ❖ No rakes, picks, or combs in the hair
- ❖ Must be socially acceptable and not distract from the educational environment (Principal's Discretion)

Hats/Caps

- ❖ Not in the school
- ❖ May be worn inside the gym during athletic events but must be forward facing

Other Notables

- ❖ Colored glasses may not be worn inside the school buildings unless prescribed by a physician
- ❖ Tattoos must be covered at all times

- ❖ No bandanas or flags will be allowed at school or school events
- ❖ Undergarments must not be visible

Pants/Shorts

- ❖ Must not be excessively loose/oversized (baggy or saggy), must rest on the hips
 - ❖ Must not be excessively tight, must not be see-through
 - ❖ Spandex material is not allowed (i.e. No yoga pants, no leggings, no tights, no bike shorts, etc.)
 - ❖ No rips, holes, or tears (No exposure of undergarments or skin)
 - ❖ Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than mid-thigh as measured from the anterior position (person standing upright, facing forward, with arms at their sides); must not have slits in the side of the shorts that does not meet the mid-thigh length requirement
 - ❖ Must be of a solid color / stripes on the side are permitted and may be a different color ❖ No cutoffs;
- All pants, shorts, skirts, skorts or capris must be hemmed, neat, and without patches or holes and must not be frayed
- ❖ Designs are allowed on pockets only and must not display negative imaging
 - ❖ Joggers that are cuffed at the bottom are allowed granted they are not of a spandex material

Shirts

- ❖ Solid colored, polo-type collared shirt and henley style (no collar with 2-3 buttons, bottom button must be buttoned appropriately) shirts are allowed
- ❖ Weimar ISD spirit shirt or T-shirt earned through participation in a school sponsored event are allowed
- ❖ Solid colored, collared button up shirts (dress shirts, fishing shirts) are allowed as long as all buttons with the exception of the top 2 are buttoned appropriately
- ❖ College & United States Military Shirts are allowed
- ❖ No shirts supporting another high school will be allowed
- ❖ No logo larger than two square inches (small post-it note)
- ❖ Untucked shirts may not be longer than the wrist
- ❖ Shirts are considered too short if the midsection is exposed when the hands are extended above the head
- ❖ Solid Colored undershirts, Under Armour, and turtlenecks may be worn under appropriate shirt ❖ Low cut necklines, bare backs, midsection, or shoulders are not permitted
- ❖ Halter tops, tube tops, or blouses with Spaghetti Straps are not permitted
- ❖ Tank tops, muscle shirts, sleeveless shirts, etc. are not permitted

Jackets, Hoodies, and Sweatshirts

- ❖ Must be of a Solid color, or;
- ❖ Weimar ISD spirit or one earned through participation in a school sponsored event, or;
- ❖ College and United States Military Design.
- ❖ Hunting Camo Jackets, Hoodies, and Sweatshirts are allowed (No digital camo permitted)
- ❖ No logo larger than two square inches (small post-it note)
- ❖ Hoods may not be worn in the building
- ❖ Coats, Jackets, Hoodies and/or sweatshirts worn on cold days do not have to meet the requirements as long as they are removed upon entering the building; they may be worn outside (including PE and recess time at Elementary/JH)

Shoes

- ❖ Closed toe shoes must be worn at all times (i.e. open-toe shoes, slides, sandals, flip-flops, and any other shoes that expose the toes are not permitted)
- ❖ Footwear with a back open heel or that fails to securely cover the foot is also prohibited
- ❖ Crocs and other branded clogs are not permitted
- ❖ Houseshoes are not permitted

Other Elementary Guidelines Include:

- Cosmetics and artificial fingernails should not be worn
- Girls must wear bloomers, legging, or shorts under their dresses or skirts
- Leggings are permitted for PK-2nd grade girls

Extra-curricular Recognition Day

- Fridays are considered special extra-curricular days. Students may wear clothing that reflects their affiliate school organization. (Examples include but are not limited to: “Band” sweatpants; “UIL State” sweatpants / t-shirts; specialized FFA shirts / sweatshirts / sweatpants; football jersey, cheer uniform, etc.)

Hair Checks will be done weekly on Thursdays to allow for the student to remedy their dress code issue by the start of the following week.

If the principal determines that a student’s grooming or clothing violates the school’s dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school and return to the classroom.

If the problem cannot be corrected at school, the principal will work with the student and parent to obtain an acceptable change of clothing for the student in a way that minimizes loss of instructional time. Disciplinary action may, however, still be taken.

All Dress Code Violations that are not able to be immediately remedied will be documented and disciplined according to the following policies:

1st Offense: Verbal Warning

2nd Offense: Written Letter Home to Parent; must be signed and returned by parent or guardian

3rd Offense: Detention; must be signed and returned by parent or guardian

4th Offense: Detention; Conference with Student and parent/guardian

5th Offense: 1 Day of ISS; must be signed and returned by parent or guardian
