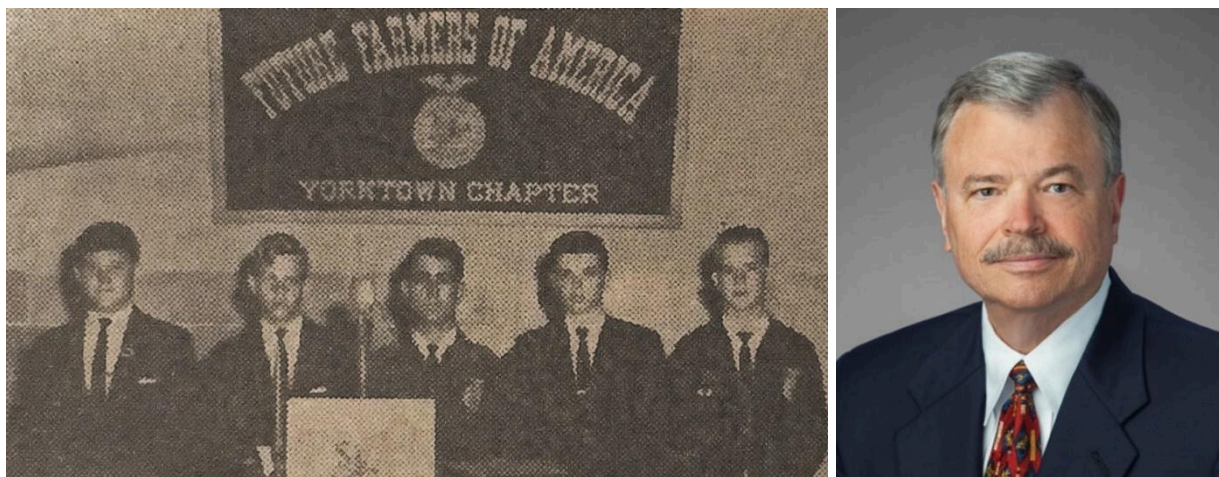


Marvin J. Migura Foundation Scholarship:

Have participated in the Colorado County Fair at least once in the last 4 years.

Plan to attend a 2/4-year college/university or trade school.

Scholarships Award: Up to (3) \$3,000 scholarships

Application Deadline: March 31st

Essay Topic:

Describe a portrait of you, as a rural high school senior, AND explain how this scholarship will help you in your future endeavors.

Essay Instructions:

500 words min., 600 words max. The essay should be double-spaced and include the word count at the end of the essay.
