Charles Henke stated the new Sexual Instruction Law requires parent to Opt-In their child to participate in the instruction. On November 1st, there will be a parent meeting in the evening for 5th grade parents, then a presentation for parents 6th-12th grades. November 2nd will be the date for the presentations. Leslie Kloesel stated the Spinal Screening for girls' 5th and 7th grades, and boys' 8th grade will be done during PE/Athletics. ● Counseling, Psychological, and Social Services: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Lindsay Fisbeck stated she is working on the new Legislative changes for the 2021-2022 SY the bills passed support social-emotional learning (SEL), school counseling, and suicide prevention.
